Ethical considerations in research are a set of principles that guide your research designs and practices. These principles include voluntary participation, informed consent, anonymity, confidentiality, potential for harm, and results communication. Researchers must always adhere to a certain code of conduct when collecting data from others. These considerations protect the rights of research participants, enhance research validity, and maintain scientific integrity. The following checklist is to be considered and followed in completing the PB Research Ethics Form (8B & 8C) for the Application for Research Ethics Review and Verification Approval process.
